SUBJECT: 6:03 P.M. TIME CERTAIN - Public Hearing No. 3: Public Hearing to Receive Input from the Community Regarding the City Council Election District Boundaries Draft Map

RECOMMENDATION:

That City Council conduct the third Redistricting Public Hearing and:

1. Receive a report from the City's Consultant, National Demographics Corporation (NDC) on the City Council election district boundaries draft map and demographic analysis; and
2. Receive input from the community on the draft map and the election district boundaries; and
3. Direct staff to return to Council at the February 28, 2022 Council meeting with an Ordinance that includes the draft map and demographics for first reading.

DISCUSSION:

Every ten years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. Assembly Bill 849 (2019) and Assembly Bill 1276 (2020) require cities and counties to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings and doing public outreach. In Yucaipa, the City Council is responsible for drawing council districts and the redistricting process must be completed by April 17, 2022.

On November 18, 2021, the City Council held its second redistricting public hearing and received a presentation from NDC. NDC presented the updated 2020 demographics for the existing map by populating the existing district boundaries with the 2020 data. NDC reported, based on their review, that the districts are population balanced, are reasonably compact, and that the population deviation of 8.66% is under the threshold of 10% in terms of percentage between the largest district and the smallest district. After discussion, the City Council voted to retain the existing City Council Districts.

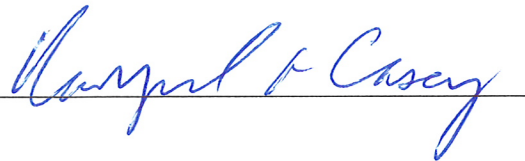
The draft map has been evaluated by NDC and meets the standards established by the relevant legal authority. These standards and requirements include equal population in the districts, Federal Voting Rights Act compliance, no racial gerrymandering, contiguous districts, addressing communities of interest, easy identifiable boundaries, compactness of the districts, and respect for voters' wishes and continuity in office. The draft map and the 2020 district demographics were posted to the City's website on January 18, 2022.

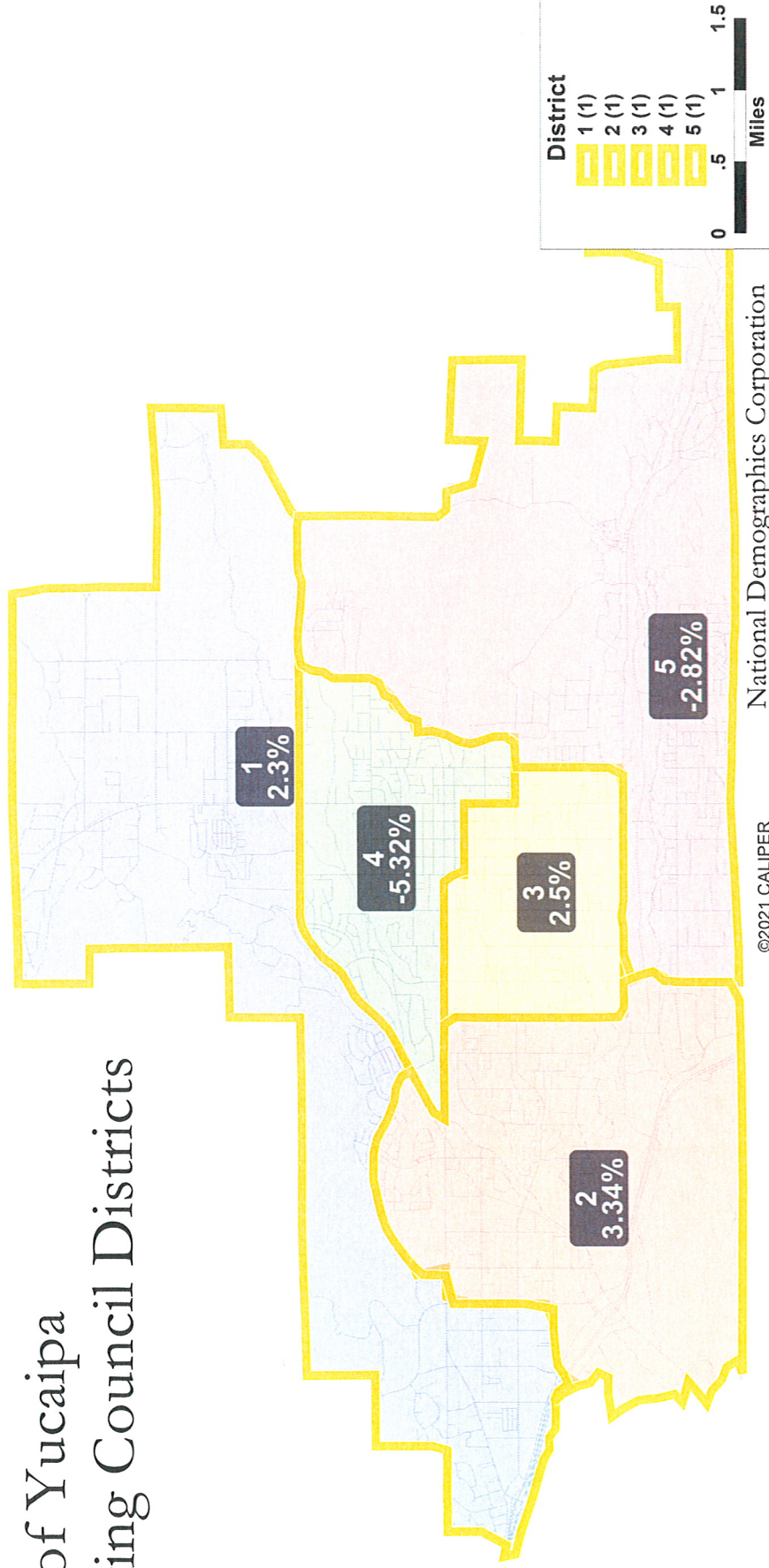
FISCAL IMPACT:
